- Discussing current issues concerning the Rail Freight Corridors



















Traffic development

Number of trains per border (source: IMs' national systems)






Update of RFC Amber Transport Market Study (TMS)



- Harmonized approach by all eleven Rail Freight Corridors
- Supported by external consultant contracted by RailNetEurope (RNE)
- Consultations of RAG-TAG-Members and stakeholders during second half of 2024
- Finalization: December 2024



New activity launched



- Analysis of operations at border crossing Hodoš/Őriszentpéter (SI-HU border) ongoing
- Objective: Identify prospects for improvement and improve procedures



Performance schemes analysis




- Analysis of performance schemes applied on RFC AMBER
 - Concluded in December 2023 (see following slides)
- Discussion of problems in specific cases during RAG-TAG-Meetings
 - Continuing upon need → Feeding experiences/knowledge elaborated in RFC Amber into future merged RFC Amber + Baltic-Adriatic
- Promotion of potential new models for coordination between railway infrastructure and terminals
 - Innovative approach from the Budapest-Bilk terminal, as presented by RAG-TAG Spokesperson
- Potential next steps
 - Analysing impact of new capacity regulation on performance schemes

Outlook




- RFCs adapting to new European Transport Corridors (ETCs) based on revised TEN-T-Regulation (expected to enter into force in June/July 2024)
- RFCs Baltic-Adriatic and Amber to form the core of one of the nine ETCs
- Customer benefits
 - More route options
 - Higher resilience, due to re-routing options within one corridor
 - RFC offer "in one hand", instead of larger overlapping sections
 - Extension to Croatia
 - Joint RAG-TAG-meetings
- Close coordination started between Members of RFCs Baltic-Adriatic, Amber and HŽ Infra for the setting up of the new corridor governance
