Corridor objectives – conceptual framework



- Corridor objectives laid down in the implementation plan
- Currently mostly of qualitative and very general nature
- Future corridor objectives to be:
 - complemented by indicators operationalising the objectives
 - Indicators based on an objectively defined methodology
 - accompanied by a monitoring system to assess the current situation and progress
 - specified by target values or verbal description

→ RFC AMBER opted for deriving corridor objectives as far as possible on the KPIs commonly agreed among RFCs







Step 1:

Selection of indicators (KPIs), from which corridor objectives shall be derived

- How many objectives?
- Which KPIs?
- Additional non-quantifiable objectives?



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Steps for definition of corridor objectives (cont.)

Step 2:

Definition of target values

- Absolute values or percentage values?
- Definition of time horizon for achievement of target values

+ verbal description of non-quantifiable objectives (if any)



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Set of commonly applicable KPIs

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CAPACITY

- Volume of offered capacity (PaPs and RC)
- Volume of requested capacity (PaPs and RC)
- Number of requests (PaPs and RC)
- · Number of conflicts (PaPs)
- Volume of pre-booked capacity (PaPs)
- NEW: Ratio of pre-booked capacity (PaPs)
- Average planned speed of PaPs

OPERATIONS

- Punctuality at origin (delay ≤ 30 and ≤ 15 minutes)
- Punctuality at destination (delay ≤ 30 and ≤ 15 minutes)
- Number of trains crossing a border along the RFC
- NEW: Train kilometers of trains crossing a border along the RFC
- NEW: Dwell times in border sections (planned and actual)



MARKET DEVELOPMENT

- Number of trains per border
- NEW: Train kilometers of trains per border
- Ratio of capacity allocated by the C-OSS and the total allocated capacity



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Proposed corridor objectives



- **Objective 1**: Average planned speed of PaPs (Capacity Mgmt KPI)
- **Objective 2**: Punctuality at destination (Operational KPI)
- **Objective 3**: Dwell times in border sections (Operational KPI)
- **<u>Objective 4</u>**: Number of trains per border (Market KPI)
- **Objective 5**: Provision of paths with improved parameters, e.g. train length or train weight (Qualitative KPI)



Time horizons for target values:

- **Short-term**: 2024
- Medium-term: 2028 (5 years)

Monitoring of indicators will be done on an annual basis
